## The GNOT

Technical problems so no Saturday bulletin.

No surprises early on. WA Country were the only provincial team to make it to the round of 16. The round of 8 saw the usual 6 Sydney and 2 Adelaide teams.

After two more 48-board knock outs, Adelaide 1 (NAGY) and Sydney 2 (HANS) went through super Saturday undefeated. They could sleep in Sunday morning and await their semi-final opponents.

While this was going on, losing teams entered a Swiss where Sydneys 1 & 5 finishing on top. They would meet the last KO losers, Sydney 3 and Adelaide 2 in the 20-board Sunday morning repechages.

Sydney 1 (CUMMINGS) had won the last three GNOTs but lost to Sydney 3 (NUNN) 24-53. Sydney 5 (GUMBY) beat Adelaide 2(CHAN) 52-41.

In the 48-board semi-finals, HANS beat GUMBY & NAGY beat NUNN.

## The Final at Double Bay

They played the final fast at Double Bay, despite screens and bidding boxes. When I turned up at 4pm to kibitz and take a few photos, it was all over and most of the South Australians were already half way to the airport.

Sydney 2 had picked up 31 IMPs in the final set to win by 4 IMPs.

There were heaps of swings and any of 10 boards in the last set could have been THE ONE.

It's funny how featherlight bidders always expect their partners to be rock solid. Richman doubled 2NT, which makes easily but EW ran, eventually playing 4♣x for -200.

Richman led his fourth highest club! Declarer looked at this for a while and rose ace. Now the 3-0 trump break means he can't quite do it. If they'd been 2-1, he could have stripped North down to hearts and pulled a low heart off table.

Did West bid 6♠ because he knew the trailing team would bash slam? Not this time – 13 IMPs to Sydney.

Since it's inception, Sydney teams have won 15 GNOTs. Adelaide 5 and Melbourne 1.

This is an expensive event for the ABF, flying in 30-odd players, but it's a big earner for the states, attracting hordes of gold point hunters.
