#### A few changes

The big change in the GNOT is starting a day earlier, partly to accommodate the inaugural *Dick Cummings Blue Ribbon Pairs*. This will be one of the few ABF events with prize money; I'm sure Dick would approve. It's sponsored by Dick's paper, *The Sydney Morning Herald*, with \$4000 in cash prizes.

By Saturday morning, 38 of the 44 GNOT teams will be at a loose end. I guess you could watch some of the semis or tramp around Sydney but the real bridge players will keep going with the Cummings Pairs, which starts at 2pm Saturday. There is also an (easier?) qualifying event at Lindfield Bridge Club, same start time.

Another bonus for starting the GNOT a day early is that the final will be over before the SNT starts, eliminating the problem of poisoned teams.

## **GNOT** preview

Last year a Sydney team stopped the run of Adelaide wins and they're back to defend with an unchanged line-up (Sydney 1 on the back page). The first four Sydney teams are all strong, as are Adelaide 1 and look out for Perth 2.

The captains of Interstate and country teams can collect a cheque from the Convener, John Brockwell, to cover travelling expenses.

Teams that have pessimistically booked flights out on Saturday evening can reschedule if they scrape through to the final. The ABF will cover any impost.

There are 44 teams, same as last year. Knockout matches are 32 boards from Round 2, 16 boards in the Swiss (no Yellow systems).

Friday is a tough day, 80 boards, so get a good night's sleep!

#### **Provincial Pairs**

This event will be staged on Saturday 11 November as part of the qualifying sessions for the Dick Cummings Pairs. Thus, it will be a 2-session pairs event.

Pairs that have played in the GNOT representing country regions, the Northern Territory and Tasmania, that have been eliminated, and then play in the Dick Cummings Pairs will automatically be regarded as eligible for the Australian Provincial Pairs Championship. A trophy will be awarded to the winning pair.

#### **Olympiad**

Australia did okay in Holland, the most recent WBF event. The Open Team got off to a flying start and made the second stage for the first time ever.

Finishing fourth in their section, they were chosen as opponents by Italy, the eventual winners, in the Round of 16. They lost by 80 IMPs in a sloppy match.

Burgess - Marston were the anchor

pair, playing all but two matches in the qualifying and all of the Italy match. Newman - Thomson also had a heavy workload but Mullamphy - Richman were very much the third pair, playing just 5 matches of 17 in the qualifying and half the Italy match. Part of the reason for this was the illness of Lidia Beech.

This naturally affected the Women's team, which started okay but faded

to finish out of the top 10 in their section. The Seniors team came fifth in their event
