R J Cummings Pairs

40+ tables for the First Dick Cummings Blue Ribbon Pairs was a promising beginning. It should grow, slotted neatly between two national teams championships.

The name is promising. The main pairs event in Canberra used to be the Blue Ribbon, renamed some years ago then subdued by the Swiss Pairs. Now there's an event to challenge Surfers.

The prize-giving was preceded by a presentation to the Cummings family. Keith McDonald covered Dick's record as a member of the Big Four that dominated Australian bridge for 20 years. Dick played 4

Olympiads and 6 Bermuda Bowls. Dick always emphasised ethics and demeanour at the table.

Peter Gill said he learned the finer points of the game kibitzing Tim and Dick at table one at the NSWBA.

GNOT - same old story

It was Sydney vs Adelaide again in this year's GNOT final, with the defending champions, Sydney 1, winning a tight final that blew out in the final quarter.

Earlier, these two teams survived the repechage (or is it a warm-up?) then proceeded to win their Saturday semis against the rested and previously unbeaten Sydneys 2 & 3. So the two Swiss leaders would fight out the final.

The 1♠ rebid worked will, getting a meaningful rebid. The natural 4NT seemed to rule out grand slam. Looked pretty easy.

However, there was an aces accident at the other table. 7NT was doubled by Cummings as North for a heart lead, dummy's first bid. Just as well – a 32 IMP swing on the lead!

It looks normal to double 1 but Dyke saw further and was able to get his exact shape across.

South led the $\heartsuit K$. Klinger won the ace and led the $\bigstar K$. North won and led the $\bigstar J$, good. A spade continuation shoots it but he switched back to trumps for -140. Cummings - Mullamphy scored +140 in 2 \bigstar for 7 IMPs in.

This was -800. Chadwick naturally planned to convert 4° to 4 to show blacks but Klinger's imaginative 4NT complicated matters. Beauchamp took a while to catch on.

At the other table, South passed 3◊. Newman bid 3♠ and passed partner's 4♡. South led ◊A-another, ruffed. Thomson led the ♡K. South ruffed and continued diamonds. Now declarer was able to get his club loser away on a spade.

Blue Ribbon Pairs Final

Two sessions of qualifying at the Vista and Lindfield produced a 14-table final of uneven quality, with some top class pairs.

Suzie Coleman & George Finikiotis led at half time, with Ish & Peter lying fifth.

North was keen to ask for aces but South thought this was RKC Blackwood in hearts. Peter Gill led a club and declarer brightened. She won the \clubsuit J with the king, played the A, crossed to the A and pitched dummy's spade on the A.

She was now cold on the heart guess but, lacking faith in her divining powers, she ran the $\clubsuit K$ to lose the two aces after all.

Two off on a diamond lead. To George, 4♦ sounded like a splinter but systemically it shows a stiff *heart*. Not a bad idea but dangerous for a casual partnership.

1NT was 10-12, hence Gill's pass. Tim led the \bigstar K, ducked all round. Declarer might have had \bigstar A-J-8 so Seres switched to the \diamond 8 to the 9-J-K. Murray Green won the first club with the king and returned the \bigstar J.

When Ish ran the clubs, Tim was under pressure in three suits. He pitched a heart so declarer played $\heartsuit K$ -A-another to win the last trick with dummy's $\diamondsuit Q$ for +120.
