It seems routine to win with the A, play the A and the A and the A and the is one down. West did the right thing by playing the A, high-hate: seven – ten? – queen. South ruffed the 4 and played A, ace. East switched to A. West won and returned A, ace. Then came A, ace, ruffed, A to K, J to discard 9, 10 tricks, N-S +620.

West dealer : North-South vulnerable



At the other table, North was in $4 \triangleq$ after a transfer bid by South. West had shown hearts and East had supported hearts. East led the \checkmark 9 (no heart honours). West took the \checkmark A and shifted to the \diamond 4, low, king. East cashed the \clubsuit A and the \bigstar A meant one down, East-West + 100 and 12 Imps to GUPTA.

For DONNER, South was in 4 \Rightarrow after North opened a strong 1 \Rightarrow and East competed in hearts. West led the \forall A and switched to the \diamond 4: seven – king – eight. East cashed the \Rightarrow A and South ended one down, East-West +100.

BLASS North-South: West opened 1^{\heartsuit} , North overcalled 2^{\bigstar} , East bid 4^{\heartsuit} , all pass. North led the $\frac{4}{9}$. West won with dummy's $\frac{4}{9}$ and ran the $\frac{9}{9}$ to the $\frac{1}{7}$ K. North played the $\frac{4}{9}$ and South ruffed. West could not avoid losing two diamonds, one light, North-South +50 and 4 Imps to BLASS.

STREET North-South: With East-West passing, North opened 1. South responded 1. North rebid 3. all pass. East led the $\forall 8$. West took the $\forall A$ and returned a heart. Declarer finished three down, -300, but could have done better.

BRIDGE SCANNER North-South: $1 \checkmark : 2 \clubsuit : 3 \bigstar -$ good heart raise : Pass, $3 \checkmark :$ Pass : $4 \checkmark$, all pass. The play went the same way as in BLASS N-S above, North-South +50 and 8 Imps to BRIDGE SCANNER.

RUSSIA North-South: Pass : $1 \ge 1 \lor$ (no suit quality needed) : $2 \lor$ (transfer to spades), $4 \lor$: $4 \ge 1$, all pass. $\lor 8$ lead to $\lor A$, $\diamond 4$ switch: seven – king – ace. East-West +100.

DE BOTTON North-South: After a complex auction, South was in $4 \pm$, doubled by West. After $\forall A$ lead and $4 \pm A$ switch, seven, king, and $\pm A$ cashed, finished one down, -200 and 3 Imps to RUSSIA.

BLASS North-South: After the auction given, West led the 4, a poor choice. Dummy's 8 held trick 1. Then came \forall 10: jack – king – six and the \forall 2 to the \forall A. East switched to the 4Q, ace. Declarer finessed the 4J, overtook the 4K and ditched dummy's club loser on the 49. Declarer lost 2 diamonds, but had 10 tricks, +620.

Why was the \bigstar 4 lead so bad? Firstly, there was nothing in the auction to suggest the need for an attacking lead, no evidence of a long suit in dummy or with declarer outside trumps. Secondly, South's 4 \bigstar , transfer me to your major, implied length and probably strength in both majors. South was prepared to play in 4 \bigstar . In effect, the \bigstar 4 start was leading a suit bid by declarer. The passive club lead would be the primary choice, with the \checkmark 3 as second pick.

DONNER North-South: $2 \forall : 3 \Leftrightarrow : 4 \forall$, all pass. East led the $\bigstar K$, ace. The $\forall 2$ went to the queen and ace. East cashed the $\bigstar Q$. What next? West had played $\bigstar 2 - \bigstar 4$, lowest card each time as suit-preference for diamonds. East switched to the $\blacklozenge J$, king, ace. West cashed the $\blacklozenge Q$ and continued with the $\blacklozenge 6: \forall 8, \forall J$. That was two down, East-West +200 and 13 Imps to BLASS.

GUPTA North-South: P : P : 1NT : P, $2 \blacklozenge -$ hearts : P : $2 \heartsuit$: P, P : $3 \clubsuit$: P : P : $3 \heartsuit$, all pass. West led the \bigstar 2: seven – queen – ace. Declarer played a trump to the queen and ace. The defence followed the same path as in DONNER N-S above to score five tricks and take $3 \heartsuit$ one down, East-West +100.

STREET North-South: South: 2 -multi, weak two in hearts or in spades : Pass : 4 -transfer me to your major : Pass, 4 -hearts : Pass : 4 -he
