341. Get shorty, not shirty

The deal arose in the 2017 Spingold (USA Open Teams) semi-final match between DIAMOND and MITTELMAN.

At one table, MITTELMAN North-South bid 1NT : 3NT, all pass. West led the \checkmark 6. East took the \checkmark A and returned the \checkmark 10 (unblocking), queen, king. West continued with the \checkmark 9 and East unblocked the \checkmark 8. The defence took six hearts, the \diamond A and \bigstar A, four down, East-West +200.

Yesterday's column mentioned 3-level splinters as an attractive option after a 1NT opening. That is what North did at the other table with DIAMOND North-South:

4 \checkmark 5 \bigstar All Pass

(2) Some 1-suiter
(3) 0-1 heart
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South lost to the three missing aces, one down, -50 but +4 Imps. You might not think that 4 Imps is such a big deal, but suppose you swap South's $\forall Q$ for East's $\forall A$. Now the 1NT : 3NT bidders go three down, -150, but 5 \clubsuit makes for +400 and +11 Imps. You might consider whether your 1NT : 3-level responses work well for you. If they are not great, you might consider swapping to splinters over 1NT.

A further development is submarine splinters over 1NT: a 3-level suit response to 1NT shows shortage in the next suit. Thus $1NT : 3 \clubsuit =$ short diamonds, $1NT : 3 \blacklozenge =$ short hearts, $1NT : 3 \blacktriangledown =$ short spades and $1NT : 3 \bigstar =$ short clubs. This allows opener to bid responder's short suit to say, 'Not keen on 3NT. Let's find our best fit'. Higher 3-level bids are natural by opener and include 3NT as an option. For example, $1NT : 3 \clubsuit$ (short diamonds), $3 \bigstar = 4$ spades and diamonds stopped for 3NT.
