GRAND FINAL: USA1 304 won from Italy 303, after an extraordinary (but correct) Director ruling and Appeals Committee hearing about whether the very last card played on the very last hand was played or not. Bronze medal went to USA2. Drama galore as Italy came from 64 IMPs behind about 22 boards to go, to lead by 21 IMPs with two boards to go, only to lose 22 IMPs on the last two boards.

USA1 had a 13 IMP carryforward from the Qualifying Stage. Italy's revokes cost 1 and 2 IMPs respectively. Versace with DAJ9xx opposite Kxx ran the jack through Qxx (with 10x under the AJ9xx) to make a brilliant doubled contract near the end.
