Australia qualified in 6th place out of 22 and lost to Italy in the Quarter Final.

Qualifiers in order: Italy, USA1, Poland, Norway, Ch Taipei, Aus, Bulgaria, USA2 (by 1 VP). Non-qualifiers included: Canada, Indonesia, China, Sweden (big surprise) and NZ (16th).

Datums are on the Monte Carlo Website's Results Page now. They suggest that A-S played 9 matches for Australia (10 according to line-ups below) and D-F played 15 matches (14 from line-ups below). 1st: A Spanish pair, 2nd A-S +0.83 Imps per board from 144 boards, 11th D-F +0.52 from 224 boards, 13th Bach-Burgess +0.50 240 bds for NZ, 28th R-T +0.07 from 224 boards (but they played a lot as Australia's worst results happened when they sat out), 40th Cornell-Mayer -0.13 224 boards for NZ, 42nd Lauria-Versace -0.13 224 boards for Italy, 43rd Helgemo-Helness -0.13 208 boards for Norway, 61st of 64 J-J 208 bds for NZ.

Won by USA1. Just a round robin. 7th Australia. 2nd France, 3rd USA2, 4th Indonesia.

Daily Bulletin #4 reports on Australia's Round 5 match vs Japan. Daily Bulletin #9 reports on Australia's Round 13 match vs Israel.

DATUMS: Daily Bulletin #9 includes Seniors Datums which are clearly inaccurate - the datums imply that all three winning USA1 pairs scored lower in the datums than all three USA2 pairs which is impossible even allowing for maximum wins. These inaccurate datums suggest that for Australia, K-N played 240 boards for +0.25 IMPs per board (17th), L-L played 216 boards for +0.04 IMPs per board (23rd) and H-W played 192 boards for +0.02 IMPs per board (24th). An Egyptian pair head the datums from a Pakistani pair but their accuracy is questionable.
